I mentioned a Māori proverb that translates, “success is not the work of one but the work of many.” Therefore, Greetings to you all.

Kia ora and welcome children, families, friends and staff of St Joseph's School. It is an honour to be the Principal at St Joseph's School and I am privileged to be able to welcome you this evening as we join together to celebrate another very successful year in the proud history of our school.

I was searching through Mr Ahern's files in preparation for tonight and stumbled across some of his speech making notes from 2017. Within them I noted a statement relating to the school roll, and how recent roll growth had seen the end of year total hit a long time high of 423 learners. He also noted that St Joseph's School was the 'The best kept secret in Upper Hutt'.

Well, it would be fair to say that the secret is a secret no more with 448 children currently calling St Joseph's School home and more importantly we start 2019 with an impressive 435 students on our roll. One thing those here tonight clearly agree on is that St Joseph's School is a great place to be.

With history in mind, I was privileged to be invited to speak at the Catholic Women's League AGM at the St Joseph's Home of Compassion last month where some of the hard working ladies who gave much time to develop the school we know today recounted their stories of St Joseph's in the good old days. One story that remained with me was a recollection shared by one of the Sisters who stated that “often the sisters had 50 – 60 students within the classrooms and they struggled to know their names, let alone teach them to read and write”. It was at this instant that I gave thanks that firstly I wasn't a sister, and secondly how much the education landscape has changed. We pride ourselves on knowing our learners and forming effective learning relationships with them and their whanau. With our growing use of collaborative teaching practice this can now mean that it is now normal for our classroom teachers to not only work with any of the 120 students that learn within their syndicate, they also take the time to know their names and more importantly their stories, their strengths and weaknesses and how they can help them succeed.

As a school community, we are very lucky to have a professional and hardworking team of teachers and support staff who get out of bed each and every morning with a mission to do the best they possibly can to provide a learning environment that has all the ingredients required for your child's individual success. Thank you again for the great contributions each of you have made to the school and for the work you do every day with and for the children who we celebrate tonight.

I will be the first to admit that we don't get everything right all of the time but I will also back each of my team to put their hands up and be accountable for their actions and interactions with your children in their attempts to bring the best out of them in the mind, body and spirit.

I would like to acknowledge the Board of Trustees for another excellent year. The effective governance of our Board not only ensures we have the necessary funds to deliver the basics such as paying the monthly bills and future proofing our buildings. More importantly our Board has our students, teachers, the vision and mission of our school at the heart of their decision making and constantly ensure alignment between the strategic direction and our school budget so that we have the necessary resources to allow us to cater for the changing needs of your children. A big thank you from all of us.

Ngā Kaitiaki mo ngā tamariki o Hato Hohepa is another group of wonderful volunteers who are the guardians for the children of St Joseph's School. Your involvement in the creation of our Māori and Pasifika education plans and the flow on effects these have on the cultural programmes we provide our students is greatly appreciated.

Fundraising is an incredibly challenging and often thankless task that requires a huge amount of effort and commitment. Thank you Johnathan and your FOSS team for all of the good things your hardworking team of volunteers do, often unnoticed, for our tamariki. We look forward to supporting your future fundraising initiatives as they arise.

I also would like to say a huge thank you to you, the parents of the wonderful students that sit before us today. Without the much valued contributions to your children's learning our input would be far less effective. We value your partnership in our kura and encourage you to become as involved as possible in the life of our school. Last but not least, thank you to each and every one of our learners from the senior and intermediate team. Your enthusiasm, effort, cheekiness and smiling faces are the reason why I get out of bed each morning and can't wait to get to start the school day. Our vision states "Faith in the future, Love of learning and Love of life" and this is exactly what you young people live by each and every day. Enjoy your night, cheer on your mates and when the time finally comes next week have a great summer break. We look forward to seeing those that are returning to us again next year.
