We awake to promising news in relation to the ongoing negotiations between the teachers union NZEI and the Ministry of Education and hope that all parties can reach a satisfactory outcome that ultimately leads to greater outcomes and learning conditions for the kids at St Joseph's School.

On behalf of the teaching team I wish to thank the parent community once again for your support during this time. Our teachers love teaching your children and I can assure you that the first consideration when deciding to strike was the impact on the students well ahead if the dent in their pay packet.

The Well-Being Budget delivered last week also contained some positive news with the announcement that decile 1-7 state and state integrated Boards of Trustees will be able to choose to receive a \$150 per student, per year payment instead of seeking donations from parents.

Our current donation of \$100 per family generates approximately \$8,000 per year in funding which is used to supplement the operational grant the school receives from the Ministry of Education to provide our teaching and learning programme. Under the new initiative, designed to alleviate the pressure and expectation on our parents, we will receive approximately \$67,000 in additional support that immediately helps your children.

Our school Boards of Trustee will need to opt-in to the scheme by 14 November 2019 and discussions about this will take place at the up-coming meetings.

As part of the process our Board of Trustees will be consulting you, our school community, to ensure the final decision reflects your views about whether to opt-in to the scheme or not.

This weekend, the Catholic Church throughout the world celebrates one of the most important feast days of the Liturgical Year - Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost Sunday not only concludes the Easter Season, but is also regarded as the birthday of the Catholic Church. When Jesus ascended into heaven he made a promise to the disciples that they would have support to do His work on Earth. This promise was the Holy Spirit.

At Pentecost, the Apostles and their followers were gathered in a room. Jews from all over the world were gathered with Peter, the leader of the Apostles and the Eleven. At this time, a great wind blew and a flame appeared as a tongue of fire, which split itself into many individual flames above the heads of all those present.
