

Sporting Activities

Students have opportunities to participate in a wide range of sporting activities. All students have regular involvement in daily fitness, physical education and the sports enrichment programme. There are additional opportunities for students wishing to become involved in inter-school activities throughout the year. Traditionally these opportunities have included: cricket, football, rugby, netball, hockey, basketball, cross-country, athletics and swimming. Our aim is to provide opportunities for as many students as possible to participate in the sport of their choice.

Cultural Activities

St Joseph's School provides its students with opportunities to learn, engage and experience Māori and Pasifika language, and cultural meanings through the traditional art of Kapa haka and Polynesian dance. Our cultural groups perform at various school events as well as the local cultural festivals throughout the year.

Additional opportunities exist for students to learn guitar, drums and violin on a 1-1 or small group basis through Goodtime Music Academy. We also have a school choir, and dance group which performs within the local community and in the Art Splash competition each year.

OUR LEARNING PROGRAMME

At St Joseph's School, your child will have the opportunity to participate in a wide range of educational opportunities. As an integrated, co-educational school, we offer programmes based on the New Zealand Curriculum and established best practice. We believe strongly in the value of sound Numeracy, Literacy and Religious Education programmes. We are then able to develop other curriculum areas, either as individual subjects or as part of our integrated curriculum approach. We believe that children learn best when they are engaged, motivated and enjoy school. Everything we do in the year 7 & 8 area is centred on this belief.



Technology Education

Technology education at St Joseph's School presents students with a range of hands-on, creative experiences in the areas of Food, Computer-Aided Design and Production, Robotics, Coding, STEAM, and Visual Arts. Our technology program is completed on-site with specialist teachers working with small groups of children on a regular basis.

Education Outside the Classroom

The school has had a long and very successful involvement in Outdoor Education. Our year 7 & 8 students currently attend school camp at Camp Kaitoke, north of Upper Hutt on a biennial basis. We believe that this is an excellent opportunity for students to challenge their physical and emotional limits whilst bonding as a class and syndicate team. The camp has proven extremely successful (and popular) with our students over the past years. As part of the lead up to camp, our students embark on a business and enterprise unit that focuses on contributing towards the costs of camp. We also seek parent support to accompany classes on these visits.

OUR LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

All of our year 7 & 8 classrooms have been designed to maximise the learning opportunities for our students. This has been achieved by focusing on providing flexible teaching spaces, integrated technology and a close connection with our fantastic outdoor environment. All classrooms are equipped with chrome books, wireless internet access, chrome TV and quality sound systems. Students have daily access to a variety of additional ICT tools including, iPads, 3 D printers, laser cutters and robotics.



We believe that the best way to cater for all of our students is in a system of parallel classes with groups of children who have identified needs and talents coming together for specific purposes. We believe that if we structure our school in this way, continually strive to treat each child as the unique individual they are, and continually work towards providing each and every child with the educational programme appropriate to him or her, then we can, as a school, make a significant contribution to the educational opportunities and outcomes for each and every one of our students.
