Education is not a political football!

It's fantastic to see the spotlight on education. It's something we are all invested in as parents, teachers, and whanau of the tamariki that attend our school. What isn't fantastic is seeing education used as a football between politicians who often have no idea about the teaching and learning that is happening in our schools to target individual, and very diverse, needs of our learners.

St Joseph's School is very proud of the teaching and learning programs that we offer our learners. We focus deeply on the core curriculum areas of reading, writing and mathematics and provide lessons that target the specific needs of your children rather than teaching them content they already know or aren't prepared for.

Developing a new curriculum without the resourcing and support required will not provide a silver bullet to our tamariki across New Zealand. Any curriculum changes must be evidence-based and designed by experts in the field for tamariki within New Zealand contexts.

What New Zealand needs right now is a long-term strategy that brings all learners into the fold and gives them good education outcomes all of the time. Right now we have a system that is constantly changing with the government of the day, irrespective of the needs and experiences of our kids.
