This term our learners are embarking upon, discovering the essence of Kaitiakitanga - the role of guardianship over our environment. Our students have centered their inquiry around the pivotal question of how they can become devoted disciples of our waterways, as inspired by the Whakataukī "Toitu te marae a Tane, Toitu te marae a Tangaroa, Toitu te iwi" - acknowledging that the wellbeing of the land and sea is intricately connected to the thriving of the people. Exploring the waterways of New Zealand, their statistical learning has woven into their inquiry journey, igniting a curiosity that drives them to pose questions and craft hypotheses, which they will themselves pose an investigation question linking to being a Kaitiaki. From delving into the processes of recycling, our students got to visit the Upper Hutt recycling station. They are learning the significance of water in our daily lives, understanding the water cycle, the challenges of pollution, and the importance of clean water. While also learning the importance of biodiversity, which each topic has illuminated their connection to the world around them. They are beginning to gain a deeper appreciation for the environment and their role in looking after it for future generations.
