This translates to evidence-based teaching methods such as structured literacy in primary schools, equipping your child with the crucial reading, writing, and math skills they need to thrive throughout their academic life.

Supporting All Learners: Inclusion and equity are at the forefront of these priorities. We believe this means fostering a safe and inclusive environment where every child feels valued and supported, regardless of background or learning style. This summarises the learning environment our staff and students work hard to maintain at St Joseph's School

**Empowering Teachers:** The government recognises importance of a strong teaching force. Initiatives aimed at improving teacher training and development will ensure your child has access to qualified and passionate educators who can effectively guide their learning.

Kia ora e te Whānau,


As always, we started the term with our Start of Term Mass on Friday, welcoming the new tamariki and staff to our family.
